Student Workload **Expectations**

Students will be expected to complete a minimum of 240 minutes of work per day if on a reduced schedule (i.e. if a student has early dismissal) or 320 minutes of work per day if on a full schedule. During days of online instruction, students will be online with each teacher for a minimum of 45 minutes and have Center High School grading policy for distance-learning will be an additional 35 minutes of work to be completed outside of the class time.
